

PCPIRs in India





PCPIR Policy 2007, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers, Govt. of India

The policy identified 4 PCPIRs in India with an objective to:

- Promote investment in chemical and petrochemical sector
- Make the country an important hub for domestic and international market
- Have world class infrastructure with competitive environment conducive for setting up business in India

Gujarat PCPIR is one of the four PCPIRs comprising area of about 453 sq.km., also identified as Node 14 of the proposed Delhi-Mumbai Industrial Corridor (DMIC)

Gujarat PCPIR is the first Operational PCPIR in the country

Key factors that led to the development of Dahej region as a Petrochemical hub

Robust supporting infrastructure - Road, Rail, Port, Power, Gas, Water

Port - Chemical Port - Liquid Cargo with Storage Facility at Dahej

State Highway linking the region with National Highway-48

Shall be shortly Connected to Delhi Mumbai Express way, Exclusive express way from Dahej to Bharuch and Bullet Train

Efficient waste management - CETP- Common Effluent Treatment Plant & disposal line, TSDF- Treatment, storage, & disposal facility sites , incinération

Concentration of Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemical estates near PCPIR-Ankleshwar, Jhagadia and Panoli Strategically located with smooth connectivity to major cities of Gujarat

- Gujarat PCPIR (Petroleum, Chemicals and Petrochemicals Investment Region) spread over 453 sq.km. of area comprising of 44 villages is the only working PCPIR in India
- 5 GIDC Estates within PCPIR Dahej-I, II, III, Vilayat & Sayakha spread over 11,158 ha (111 sq.kms)
- Focus sector: Chemical, Petrochemical, Dyes & Pigments, Textiles, Engineering
- GIDC has earmarked and developed /in process of development of residential areas in PCPIR-Atali-I Housing, Atali-II Housing and Dahej Housing (Kesrol, Eksaal and Manad)
- More than 1600 industries have already committed investment in the region



Sanctioned Development Plan of Gujarat PCPIR






- Development plan Sanctioned on 15/09/2012



Power available from :

- 4 X 220 KV and 8 X 66 KV GETCO sub-stations.
- Gujarat Energy Transmission Corporation Limited (GETCO) has also completed construction of 220 KV sub station.
- 1200 MW gas based power plant by Torrent Power Ltd. in Dahej SEZ has been completed.



2 X 66 KV substations in Sayakha have been commenced.



 2 X 220 KV and 1 X 400 KV & 8 X 66 KV substations are planned in Dahej & Saykha & Atali Housing.





• GIDC has installed water supply capacity of 555 MLD based on Narmada river, Narmada canal and Desalination plant



PCPIR Infrastructure - Bhadbhut Barrage Project for water security



- Developed by Kalpasar department, Govt of Gujarat
- Reservoir with storage capacity of 599 million cubic meter (MCM), prevent the tidal salinity ingress and soil erosion
- Provide fresh water for domestic, agricultural and industrial activity of Bharuch, Ankleshwar and Dahej area
- Shorten the distance between Dahej to Hazira (Surat) by 20 km
- Project cost: INR 4,254 cr work in progress
- Expected Completion by Oct 2025.

Area: 25 ha in Phase-I


Logistic Park is being developed by GIDC in joint venture with Container Corporation of India Ltd (CONCOR)

Total Project Cost: INR 200 crore (excluding land)

Phase I: INR 90 crore will be completed by Aug'24

Subsequent phase: INR 110 crore

The OPaL Cracker Unit was dedicated to the nation by Hon'ble Prime Minister Mr. Narendra Modi, in March 2017
